We ask that where possible in your bubbles or through zoom meetings and phone calls that each one of you continues to discern what role you can play in our parish to bring about our vision. This also will influence what sorts of church buildings we will require in the future. There is a lot of information on our website and perhaps you could also research other parishes both nationally and internationally to see how they utilise their buildings.

A reminder of what to do during this Covid-19 time to make a difference to its effects

Stay within your bubble.

- -If you need to go out, wear a mask and remember the 2 metre social distance rule.
- -If you are unwell, seek advice from your medical centre or the Ministry of Health Covid 19 Health line 0800 358 5453
- -Wash your hands with soap and hot water and sanitize your hands and work spaces constantly.

-Use the Tracer App when you go outside your bubble.

- -Take time to reflect, wonder about our current circumstances and pray for all who are affected by this pandemic.
- -Spend time talking to others in your bubble or other family/friends on the phone or by email.

-Arrange to get vaccinated.

-If you are vaccinated keep all the rules so everyone is kept safe.

-Search the web for readings on theology, prayer, the mission of the church, use of buildings etc etc.

-Light a candle - real or virtual and pray for those who have died during Level 4 and Level 3.

In Level 3 there are no public masses or gatherings in our churches.

St Francis of Assisi Ohariu Challenge 2000 and St Vincent de Paul Covid Partnership

The parish is indeed fortunate to have Challenge 2000 as one community in our "community of communities". Challenge 2000 (which began in our parish in 1988) is deemed an essential service and has been able to provide back up and support to many individuals, groups and families throughout the Wellington area. In the past two weeks Challenge staff have been able to provide 150 grocery deliveries, children's activity packs, petrol vouchers and essential items throughout the Wellington area.

The Challenge staff and volunteers who are fully vaccinated take all the necessary Covid precautions when they accept food, pack it, or cook it and deliver it.

Our parish donated \$500.00 from the Tindall and Refugee fund we have in place for refugee families and the Johnsonville – Newlands St Vincent de Paul gave \$500.00 for our local individuals and families. Generous donors and parishioners also donated a further \$10,000.00 that was used to buy fresh food, milk, meat, veges and to continue to top up our canned goods and toiletries etc. A big thanks to the parishioners who have dropped off goods at Challenge's front door. And to members of our wider Catholic community who have organised tons of potatoes, rice and other goods for us!




