19th Sunday in Ordinary Time 8 August 2021 Year B Readings: 1 Kings 19:4-8; Ephesians 4:30-5:2; John 6:41-51

For me there are three key messages in our readings this weekend. Message 1 from Kings: "The journey of life is too hard unless we eat". Life is difficult, full of unexpected and unwanted events, losses, uncertainties and challenges.

To survive we need food, both physical and spiritual, that nourishes and sustains us on our journey.

Message 2 from Ephesians: "live in love, as Christ loved us." Christ became human to show us how to live. He is our role model. We are called to live and love as he did. What did he do? He loved and served unconditionally. He loved and helped the poor, the sick, the suffering, the outcasts. He fed the hungry, healed those in pain, gave hope to the hopeless and selflessly served others. He made love visible by what he did.



Message 3 from the gospel of John:

"whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world." Jesus our role model gave us himself so that we human beings can "enflesh" his mission today. He feeds us on our journey so that it won't be too hard to do as he did. When we say Amen when we receive and eat Christ we are saying Yes – I will be like you Jesus. I



will be your disciple and love and serve others. The bread of life changes us, nourishes us and strengthens us to be his heart, hands, mind and body in our families, church and world today.

When you say Amen and receive Christ this weekend, reflect on how you will be his "flesh for the life of the world" this coming week.



- Reaction contemplation Response. Between Stimulus and Response there is a space. In that space is our power to choose our response. In our response lies our growth and our freedom.
- Building Relationships: Communication skills are the building stones of any community or organisation or relationship – the strength of all that we do
- Attitudinal Barriers in ministry: How does one change an attitude that is no longer useful, outdated and insensitive in today's climate for effective ministry?
- Bi-Culturalism & Multi- Culturalism: To effectively communicate with an individual or group or a culture different to our own, we need to have an understanding and sensitivity to that different culture.
- Conflict Management in ministry: Conflict management is the practice
  of being able to identify and handle conflicts sensibly, fairly, and
  efficiently. Since conflicts in a community are a natural part of their
  existence, it is important that there are people who understand conflicts
  and know how to resolve them.
- Stress Distress Eustress: Recognising warning signs and strategies to assist in ministry.
- Wellness Wheel identifying in yourself areas that may need more attention in your ministry – circles of support and developing resilience for ministry.

After each or the four workshops a time of reflection and Prayer on Pope Francis's Evangelii Gaudium: THE JOY OF THE GOSPEL.

<u>Dunedin: Conversations That Count</u> that contributed into a wider discussion in the (Anglican) Diocese of Dunedin around property.



"Any decisions around the future use of Church Sanctuaries and other properties can generate strong emotional responses. For many of us they become a second home, a place we are safe, loved and in community with other. So, to talk about changing or selling the buildings affects us emotionally (as it should).

It is important therefore to take this discussion sensitively and in the love of Christ when talking with others about this topic.

In all things we give this decision to God in prayer:

Heavenly Father, we come into your presence placing our burdens at your feet.

We ask you to help us with decisions that need to be made to so that your kingdom can be here on earth as in heaven.

Lord Jesus Christ who promised your Spirit to be with us to the end of time, help us to consider and decide wisely.

May our hearts not be hardened to receive Your word.

May our eyes not be blinded, so we can see your truth and be obedient to Your will.

Amen."

# Te Ara a Maria : Mary's Way Rededication of Aotearoa New Zealand to Mary Mother of God Assumed into Heaven

On Sunday 15th August, the Solemnity of the Assumption, there will be a special Mass at St Mary of the Angels when Aotearoa New Zealand will be rededicated to Mary, Mother of God, Assumed into Heaven. The country was first dedicated to Mary under that title in 1838. This will be a National celebration with representatives from the six Dioceses of New Zealand present with the Apostolic Nuncio and the New Zealand Bishops. A new artwork honouring this occasion has been commissioned and will be presented that day. The next day the artwork will begin a Hikoi of the country to significant places (with especially Marian connections). The artwork will be brought back to St Mary of the Angels on the Feast of the Annunciation next year. The hikoi will also coincide with the Centenary of the Opening of St Mary of the Angels Church. The **National Liturgy Office** has prepared two YouTube videos (links below) to help Catholics across the country to sing the himene Mō Maria, which was composed by Bishop Pompallier. Over the years the versions, pronunciations and melodies of the hymn have varied from Pompallier's original. This has made it more difficult for us to sing the hymn harmoniously. The August 15 rededication of the country to Mary gives us an opportunity to promote Mō Maria as a national Catholic anthem.
