



Covid-19 Update The Wellington Region is in Covid-19 Alert Level Delta 2. All Masses, liturgies and parish gatherings are Cancelled. Take care.

This Sunday's Gospel includes Jesus' words:

"It is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle, than for a rich person to enter the kingdom of God" (Mark 10:);





reserves his most damning statements for matters of social justice where power is most resistant. His foundational bias is against false power and in favour of the powerless. If you do not make such points absolutely clear history shows that humans will almost always compromise on issues of justice, power, money, and inclusion."

Rohr points out how his own country, the United States, "always has all the money it needs for war, weapons, and bailing out banks, but never enough for good schools, low cost housing, universal health care, or welcoming refugees.

Jesus offers clear, contrasting statements about issues of ultimate significance and calls us to decide between them. His point is always our transformation. Unfortunately, Christians have largely managed to avoid

most of what Jesus taught so unequivocally: nonviolence, sharing, simplicity, loving our enemies."

Greetings friends from the Leadership Team

These are very difficult and challenging times in leadership as we attempt to honour both the spiritual and faith needs of our communities and also the safety and wellbeing of those same communities.

We can assure you all that we are trying to do the best for you. So where are we at right now?

Many meetings, phone calls and correspondence has been sent and received with parishioners, the Parish Liturgy Advisory Group (PLAG), the Cardinal and the ADW, since the government announcement on Monday. There is also more clarification being sought by the Cardinal relating to numbers and masses.

What we are all attempting to do is set consistent, parish-wide guidelines that will keep all people safe and our communities and city safe and well. To do this we need a comprehensive Risk Management and Pastoral and Spiritual Support Template (which we are currently finalising) that ensures Level 2 Delta guidelines are met and we have the people to implement the practices. This is what members of the Leadership Team are currently finalising as information comes to hand.

So as this newsletter is published:

- There will be no Sunday Masses this weekend
- Next week beginning Monday October 11 there will be no Weekday Liturgies, before Wednesday by which time we hope to have the people in place who can take responsibility for safely implementing the Covid Delta guidelines in the Parish template
- We need people who are vaccinated and at low risk of contracting Delta to volunteer to clean before and after Liturgies/Masses/Parish events, to take responsibility to count numbers and ensure social distancing is maintained, masks are worn and the Ministry of Health and Parish guidelines are kept.
- We need one person to take responsibility for supporting and ensuring that all the actions described on the Parish Risk template occur for EACH Liturgy and Mass.
- We also need you to access the parish app, website and be on our email database or have the number of a parishioner who you can phone, so you can be updated as changes occur.
- We also ask for your prayers for our community and country in these challenging times.
- We also encourage you to be vaccinated and reach out to those who need support to be vaccinated. As the Pope says: "this is an Act of Love - of self, others and our global village."

As more information becomes available and systems are set in place we will let you know.




Pope Francis wants to hear from YOU!


