Our Mission

Last week we heard Jesus was not welcomed by people in his home town. Far from welcoming a hometown hero, the people couldn't get past him being a carpenter – who did he think he was to perform all these miracles? Instead of dwelling on this rejection, Jesus looked outwards. He commissioned his disciples to go out in pairs and gave them his authority. In today's language he also told them to stick to the basics – don't take an extra shirt, don't even take extra food. If people welcome the Good News then you will be fed, if not, don't waste time just shake the dust off your feet and move on.

Such lack of planning might not pass muster to our modern sensibilities – trekking out with no back up plan, no spare food not even a clear itinerary? What would they say about you if you got in trouble – irresponsible! Poorly prepared! Got what you deserve!

Yet this is the call of Mission – we are sent and need to focus on what is truly important, trusting in the wisdom of the one who sent us.



This week we gather together in St Benedict's Church to celebrate one of our church patrons, St Benedict. He took another path in following the mission of Jesus. Rather than going out he

literally went to the hills and then others followed him as they joined him to live a more intensive Christian life as monks or nuns. They became famous for their hospitality, especially to strangers. There is more than one way to follow the call of Jesus.

What does all this mean for us today? Whatever our role in society we all have a call from Jesus to answer. We all have a part in the Mission of Jesus – through our home lives, in our schools and workplaces and in our communities.

Whatever the opportunities that present themselves, like the disciples and St Benedict we need to look outwards and know that we live our lives as a people with a mission. An outward focus not on what we wear or what we are to eat, but being a witness to the mission of Jesus to spreading the Good News by how we live our lives as his disciples.

Context: Cardinal John directed every parish to carry out a review of it's churches and presbyteries.

This review is to be with him, complete with developed proposals, no later than 30 October 2021.

St Francis of Assisi Ohariu Parish has begun the review that will identify how many churches the parish needs to cater for its Mass count (taking into account the availability of priests and lay pastoral leaders), and the ideal location of the church or churches.

Cardinal John reminds us that for most, if not all parishes with more than one church, this will mean reducing the number of churches in the parish.







Provision for accommodation of priests in the parish is part of the review.

His last encouragement on the directive was to be prepared to be radical in our thinking and discernment as we discern and commit to being missionary disciples bringing about the reign of God in our time.

The Leadership Formation Team invites you to be part of the Review leading up to the 30th October 2021 deadline.

As an aid to our discernment the Leadership Formation Team will be hosting a number of "Conversations" with various people who have trodden this path already and are prepared to share their experiences.

We welcome you to join.



assistance and guidance throughout the






