Covid-19 Update The Wellington Region is now in Covid-19 Alert Level Delta 2. All Masses, liturgies and parish gatherings are CANCELLED. Take care.

"Lift high the Cross, the love of Christ proclaim Till all the world adore his glorious name!"

In today's Gospel, St Peter correctly describes Jesus as the Christ but rejects the idea that Jesus would suffer. Jesus corrects Peter and tells him that those who follow Jesus will suffer.

Suffering is part of life. As we look around our Covid-stricken, climatically-challenged world, we see many carrying heavy crosses: the loss of loved ones, pain, isolation in MIQ or at home or in rest homes and hospitals, loss of livelihoods, uncertainties, the danger of floods, fires, terrorism, earthquakes and war (especially in Haiti and Afghanistan); even the challenge of living up to the Christian faith in the ordinary events of life.



At some time in our lives, we all face suffering. When we look at the Cross, we are reminded that Our Lord's passion and death have given us the way through to the fullness of the life we wish for. He did not avoid suffering but accepted it out of love for us. He has given meaning to human suffering and death.

The Cross is the symbol of the followers of Christ, a sign of life and hope for each of us, helping us with strength and courage to show – proclaim – the love of Christ in all we say and do; and, when it is permitted, to sing:

Come, Christian people, sing your praises, shout If we are silent, even stones cry out

Jesus, you wept to see our human strife Teach us compassion for each human life

Peace was your plea, and peace your loving theme Let peace be our passport, peace a living dream

Great is the cost of walking on this road To follow and to suffer with the Son of God

Worlds to be born and children yet to be Come, take up this song into eternity

Lift high the Cross, the love of Christ proclaim Till all the world adore his glorious name!

- When you go out, wear a mask and remember the 2 metre distance rule. If you do not have a mask or enough of them, please contact one of the Leadership Team or the parish office.
- If you are unwell, seek advice from your medical centre or the Ministry of Health Covid19 Healthline 0800 358 5453.
- Wash your hands with soap and hot water and sanitize your hands and work spaces constantly.
- ALWAYS use the Tracer App when you visit any sort of place for work, shopping or socialising.
- Pray for all who are affected by this pandemic and other local and world needs.
- •Definitely arrange to get vaccinated. It is as the Pope says and "act of love."
- When you are vaccinated keep all the rules so everyone is kept safe. It doesn't make you bullet proof.
- •Light a candle real or virtual and pray for those who have died, for those in homes that may still be closed to visitors and for our Auckland brothers and sisters who are still in Level 4 lockdown. They are making this sacrifice for us all.

Confirmation Programme Update

Just an update from the Confirmation Programme team. As you know, we are in Delta Level 2 and so there can't be any church gatherings until at least September 21. As a result, it is impossible to adequately prepare and practise with our Confirmation candidates, sponsors and parent/s, caregivers before September 25. There is a high probability that we may continue at level two for a few weeks longer. We simply don't know. It is important that we do keep everyone safe and all play our part to beat this Delta variant.

Therefore, for these reasons, the Confirmation Mass is cancelled on Saturday September 25. We have asked the Cardinal's secretary to try to find a possible date in his diary after the school holidays in November/early December. By then we are hoping and praying that we are in Level 1.

As soon as we hear what is possible we will get back to you. We are sorry if family members from out of town had made travel arrangements. Let's hope that they will be able to change them. It is certainly a difficult time to plan anything.
