11th Sunday in Ordinary Time 13 June 2021 Year B Readings: Ezekiel 17:22-24; 2 Corinthians 5:6-10; Mark 4:26-34

Life has a certain rhythm. We celebrate special occasions, birthdays, baptisms, first communions and funerals. Life is marked by the seasons which are marked by Festivals – of light, of darkness, of life of death. Those imported deciduous trees that survived the Wellington winds have the remnant of their autumn display. Winter is closing.

We hunker down until Winter passes and life inevitably re-emerges at Spring. The cycle continues. So it is with the Church's Cycle

Each part of the liturgical year has either a special season or is in 'ordinary time'. A special season are things like: Lent, Easter, Advent, and Christmas. Whenever the Church isn't celebrating one of these, it is Ordinary Time.

We have been through Lent, the Easter season, and three Sundays of feast days— Pentecost, Most Holy Trinity, and Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ— and so we return to Ordinary Time.

The English name "Ordinary" is intended to translate the Latin term Tempus per annum (literally "time through the year"). This doesn't mean that Ordinary Time was nothing special, because Jesus preformed miracles all throughout the year. This means that, because Ordinary Time takes up more than half of the liturgical year, it is referred to as: Tempus per annum, or "time through the year."

Green is used as a liturgical colour during these weeks of Ordinary Time. Far from being a filler between other liturgical seasons, Ordinary Time has its own meaning, signified by its own colour.

Let's spend a little time each week preparing for the Sunday Mass by reflecting on the Gospel and follow the continuing story of Jesus whose message was simply to proclaim the Kingdom of God.


This is not a 'Good-Bye' but God Bless each and everyone of you.

## **Parish Communication Survey Feedback**

Over the last weeks we invited you to take part in a Survey providing feedback to assist the Parish Admin and Pastoral Teams on how best to communicate with our Parishioners. We received 210 responses to the survey. Thank you to those parishioners who took the time to respond. The Newsletter was the most common way you received information about Parish Life. What your read was:

The suggestions that would improve our **Newsletter** broadly fell into 3 categories. The main feedback was that the **Content** should be more about our Parish People.

Many thought the Newsletter could be more than advertising events and information e.g., Mass Times and Rosters but a community paper should be about Our People.

It already takes many hours to publish the Newsletter in its current format and to realistically achieve this we may need to follow other Parishes and reduce the Sunday Newsletter to "Notices" and once a Season publish a larger edition that reports on things that have happened in the Parish, cover the work of our 24 or so various ministries, children's art, short features about parishioners that tell something of what they do to serve the church and the parishioners as an inspiration and encouragement to others. That could have a more interactive feel with "letters to the Editor" style commentary. It would probably need "reporters" to compile events.

Come and encounter the Father's love at the second XLT (eXaLT) worship night of the year, as we explore the theme 'Welcome Home' (Luke 15:20).


