Who is the greatest?

Jesus called up a young child before his disciples and said "Here is the greatest among you." It is as if the whole of mankind is queued at heaven's gates in order of what they understand to be God's preference of goodness and greatness. Jesus comes out and goes down to the farthest end of the queue, lays his hand on the head of the person closest to him and says, "Here is the greatest in my kingdom!" Jesus is surely the back-to-front, inside-out, up-side -down Man to the human way of measuring value and greatness.

We typically under-estimate the value of what is done by the 'small person'. God created every one of us in his image; he breathed his life into each one of us.


