Rise Up, Let It Go, Move On

Jesus is moved by Bartimaeus .When Jesus heard the blind man's cry, he sent the disciples to call him, 'Have faith, have courage.'

Only an encounter with Jesus gives a person the strength to face the most difficult situations.



Thoughts for our week ahead.... Firstly, only Jesus stopped, not the disciples. When the blind man cried out, they continued to walk on. If Bartimaeus was blind, they were deaf: his problem was not their problem.

Too often, we believe that in the face of constant problems, it is better to move on, instead of letting ourselves be bothered.

Sometimes our hearts are not open. We lose wonder, gratitude and enthusiasm, and risk becoming habitually unmoved by grace. We are able to speak about Jesus and work for him, but we live far from his heart.

Pope Francis calls this a "spirituality of illusion." He says,

"we can walk through the deserts of humanity without seeing what is really there; instead, we see what we want to see. We are capable of developing views of the world, but we do not accept what the Lord places before our eyes. A faith that does not know how to root itself in the life of people remains arid and, rather than an oasis, creates other deserts."

Jesus wants to include all those kept on the fringes who are crying out to him.

After being cured, the blind man follows Jesus on his path. He did not only regain his sight, but he joined the community of those who walk with Jesus. The Church I want to part of is one where we encounter others by Listening rather than talking. Conversing rather than converting.

This what opens our Hearts for a rich encounter with another. Pete sm. **Cardinal John** invites us to take part in the Synod, a two-year process from last Sunday until October 2023. This is an excerpt from his inspiring Sermon:

Last week in Rome the Holy Father asked, "Are you prepared to take part in the adventure of this journey?" Let's make it an adventure: walking together with faith; listening to each other (as Francis put it, "How good is the hearing of your heart?"); engaging in a process of healing guided by the Holy Spirit; supporting one another, looking for new paths and new ways of speaking.

This Synod's title includes three key words: 'Communion', 'Participation' and 'Mission'. Those words give a glimpse of what Synodality means and what the Church is to be.

• **COMMUNION**.... Even our God is a communion! The word emphasises the deep bond we share in the love and the unity of the Trinity. Through our

Baptism we share a common 'instinct' of faith and every one of us has a role to play in together discerning, working out and living God's will for us.

• **PARTICIPATION**.... stresses that we all have gifts, a rich diversity of gifts, to share. All of us are called together to pray, to listen, to think about, to dialogue, to discern and to be involved in pastoral decision-making. Participation also means that we make every effort to bring in and listen to those who feel excluded.



• **MISSION**.....Which highlights the fact that we can never be centred on ourselves. If we are Catholic Christians we will be outwardly focused. We exist to take the Good News out to everyone. This two-year process is to help is to understand and live out the fact that the Church does not exist for itself but in service to the coming of God's kingdom.

Do you want to be part of this great adventure? Read, listen, share, dialogue with others, have your say in the consultation process beginning today. Watching Pope Francis at Synods and listening to him, one hears over and over, "speak with boldness; don't be afraid; trust in the Holy Spirit who guides us."

Trust in God, move forward with courage, build unity through discernment, discover and help bring about God's dream for us, be positive and enthusiastic. Take seriously that word 'enthusiasm' which means 'to be filled with God!' And filled with God, we cannot go wrong.

Confirmation Programme Consultation:

The Sacramental Team needs you, our parents to have input into a decision about the Confirmation Masses that we had planned for the weekend of November 6 and 7. We are in Covid Delta Level 2 and we anticipate that this will be the case for another few weeks.

What this means is that only 100 people can attend each Confirmation Mass and we have 55 children hoping to be confirmed. So each child could have 2 people with them and perhaps their sponsor if that person was not a parent. Then we need space for the programme facilitators and support staff. At level 2 we need to stay one metre apart from each other, cannot have singing or a shared meal/celebration after. It would mean that at the Masses no extended family or members of the parish community would attend. As the Sacrament of Confirmation is about making a commitment to the faith in the context of the local church this all gets very complicated!! Some parents have already suggested that we postpone to next year.

And the team is open to suggestions and it may be possible to do both. For example, if 35 people decide to postpone until next year and 20 decide to go ahead now then this would be manageable in the sense that family members could attend and some parishioners/ community members could as well. It would still be a Covid Level 2 mass with no singing etc.

Please email or call us so we can hear your preferences and try and juggle everyone needs and dreams. We need to make a decision early next week as we will need to facilitate some extra sessions for those we have missed.

Please reply to Kitty and Sio or the parish office with any suggestions/solutions or your preference for Confirmation in our parish. AND maybe also check with our children – it's good to have their

Join Sr Sue Cosgrove and follow the footsteps of Suzanne Aubert Meri Hōhepa through Wellington city. The tour begins at Suzanne's Historic Crèche (now the Pukeahu Education Centre) in Buckle Street. This was one of the first successful crèches to operate in New Zealand. Around the corner is the Compassion Soup Kitchen in Tory Street, not far from its original location. The response of the Soup Kitchen to hunger and social isolation has been constant since 1901. Next we will visit St Mary of the Angel's, the church where Suzanne Aubert's funeral was held in 1926. Wellington stopped and thousands lined Willis and Boulcott Streets to pay their respects to this extraordinary women who had done so much to help people, regardless of faith or background. The tour finishes at Parliament. Suzanne walked through this part of town visiting politicians and supporters, and mixing her herbal remedies in Molesworth Street.
