# 4th Sunday of Easter: Good Shepherd Sunday Reflection



"Herd Immunity?"

*I have other sheep that do not belong to this fold. These also I must lead, and they will hear my voice, and there will be one flock, one shepherd.* (John 10:16)

Many would ask, why did he have to say this? Why can't it be just those who have responded to him, those he knows and know him. We have more than enough trouble alone with being one flock amongst those who know him. He adds people who do not belong.

If we ask ourselves, why did I come to mass this Sunday? I have a feeling we will not all get the same answer. But it still got you here.

It is not our job to identify those who do not belong or those who are different to us. It is our Lord Jesus' job. Thus, there is no reason for us also to identify ourselves only with those who "belong".

We gather today with all different reasons, trusting he will make us one under his shepherding. He mixes us all together, as one herd, made into one flock, until we become "immune" to one another by hearing his voice. If not today, maybe next Sunday or the Sundays to come. But we believe we will be made as one, under one Shepherd- JESUS CHRIST.
