Covid-19 Update The Wellington Region is in Covid-19 Alert Level Delta 2. All Masses, liturgies and parish gatherings are Cancelled. Take care.

Last Wednesday was the Vernal Equinox – that time of the year when nature officially says it's spring. And with that equinox come those dratted northerlies – the equinoctial gales – the ones that drive many of us to not sleep at nights. They're nature's way of blowing away all the last remnants of winter – all those dead leaves that have collected in the gutters and the drainage sumps. Clearing out all those reminders of winter and telling there is a new season ahead. Having it's own spring clean.

This is our big chance to have our own Spiritual Equinoxes – a time for us to look inside at ourselves and see what we can clean out of our own private spiritual winters: let's have our own equinoctial spring cleaning:

All those grumpy thoughts? Blow them away with a prayer or two and a hope that we'll do better; bad habits? Let the wind of the Holy Spirit blow into your lives and help you do better; Got that Covid down in the dumps feeling? There's always Hope – try and have confidence that there WILL be a future – one day it WILL go away.

Let the Spiritual Equinox blow into your hearts and souls and minds and begin a whole new Spring; talk to God in prayer – it doesn't have to be a fancy prayer or big or long –

Thomas Merton once wrote "The best way to pray is STOP, let prayer pray within you whether you know it or not" – sounds complicated?

Nah – all life is a prayer so if you live your life well you are praying to God: want to make it a bit more formal – recite the Our Father once a day and you might just be surprised to see what benefits you will get.

SO: let the spiritual equinoctial gales rip into your soul, clean it of all the deadwood and have a marvellous spring (even though those other gales might keep you awake at night).

And if you want a bodily spring clean – Grandma used to swear by Rhubarb Pie.


