Trinity Sunday 30 May 2021 Year B

Readings: Deuteronomy 4:32-34,39-40; Romans 8:14-17; Matthew 28:16-20

Winter is knocking at our doors and after the wonderful Easter Season we are back to Ordinary Liturgical Time. But today – Holy Trinity Sunday - there is nothing "ordinary": we gather to celebrate the greatest mystery of our faith.

We can meditate, contemplate, talk about the Trinity for weeks and weeks and still know and understand so little about it. Nonetheless, the extraordinary relationship of love as it is lived between the Father and the Son through the Holy Spirit characterises us all as Christians, it is



our distinctive mark: we are called to *live the Trinity*. We can seek to imitate the love of the Trinity by living mutual love among us. And it might be helpful to point out the different ways in which we can have a relationship with the three divine Persons.

The Father: As adoptive children we pray "Abba Father" casting all our worries on Him with an act of faith, certain that he will take care of everything. And how many personal or worldly 'worries' have we entrusted to the Father!

The Son: the "God with us". Today 76 children of our Parish are receiving their First Holy Communion: it's their special encounter with Him. But Jesus is not only present when we gather around the altar for the Eucharist; he is in the Word, in the unity with our brothers and sisters, in the poor, in the Church, in our hearts. He walks among us, with us!

The Holy Spirit: He always answers when we call upon him offering us words of wisdom; he gives us comfort and light.

In the Christian tradition, when we begin our prayers, whether as individuals or a community, we do so by making the sign of the cross and invoking the Trinity. When we pray the Glory be..., we do the same. We deliberately and consciously ask the Trinity to be part of our prayer and daily life.

Perhaps on this Feast of the Holy Trinity we could say these prayers more slowly, consciously trying to nurture the relationship with each one of the three divine Persons within us.

We ask this in Jesus' name.


