Readings: *Deuteronomy* 6:2-6, *Hebrews* 7:23-28, *Mark* 12:28b-34

"You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength and You shall love your neighbour as yourself. There is no other commandment greater than these."

LOVE.LOVE. Jesus doesn't mention lots of rules, the ten commandments or the many, many laws of his faith tradition. What he does is simplify and complexify everything! He gives the Pharisees and us two laws, two requests.



Jesus tells us that Love of God and love of our brothers and sisters is the meaning of our lives as Christians, as Catholics.

Love of God and **love of neighbour** are different sides of the same coin. We can't have and live one without the other.

Jesus is saying it's not enough to love God. We must love our neighbours - our brothers and sisters too. We must see Christ in the faces of all those we come across in our parish, community and world and then be love and spread love through our words and actions. Jesus is our living example of how to LOVE. His mind, his heart, his soul, his hands had one purpose. Jesus the great lover gave and gives everything to show us what happens when God's commandment of LOVE is lived. Love is the measure of our faith. Jesus is asking, challenging us to be his disciple and to love as he loved. To follow these two great commandments above all else. This is a mind and heart provoking and inspiring gospel.

This week lets reflect on a question that Pope Francis asks himself in relation to this gospel:

"Love is the measure of faith. My faith is as I love. And faith is the soul of love.

How much do I love? Each one answer silently. How is my faith? KITTY MCKINLEY

Confirmation Update:

Greetings all and thank you for your response to our email regarding the Confirmation Mass possibilities.

For those who have requested your child be confirmed this year s, we have organised a Special Confirmation Mass on Saturday November 6th 2021 at 4pm at SS Peter and Paul's Johnsonville. PLEASE note the time and venue change. The reason for the change is so parishioners can attend their "usual" Saturday night mass at St Andrew's and our numbers won't prevent them from attending. An email has been sent to you all.

A reminder that there can only be a maximum of 100 people in the church, sitting in their own bubbles and at least a metre apart, wearing masks if over the age of 12.

We have 18 children who are going to be Confirmed on Saturday November 6th 2021. This is all we can have at this event. At this stage each child can bring four other family members = a total of 5 mass goers per family.

This adds up to 89. The remaining 11 spaces will be for the Programme leaders and those leading the Liturgy.

PLEASE if you have less than five attending then let us know so we can then add a sibling or grandparent from another family!

PLEASE also note that we would like your child to attend a Confirmation meeting on Sunday October 31st at 3.30pm, followed by a practice at 4:45 for parents, sponsors if they are available and parent/s.

We would also like to have a final practice on Friday November 5th at 4:45pm at SS Peter and Paul's.

We are working hard to make a memorable, Spirit filled occasion for our children.

I will also attempt to meet with the St Benedict's children and the St Bridget's children at their respective schools this week.

As you know we will not be able to have community singing at this event. We will work to have some form of Music and also a slide show. If you have any suggestions regarding the Liturgy/Music or would like to help then please get back to either Kitty or Sio.

Vaccination certificate requirements

At all levels, businesses, retail, and public facilities will generally be able to remain open for vaccinated people.

Even at the Green Level our Liturgies will require all in the congregation to present a Vaccination certificate so that we do not have to limit the number who are in our Churches.

A vaccination provides you, your family and your Parish community better protection against the virus. When everyone is vaccinated, this helps to end the pandemic.


