

Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ 6 June 2021 Year B Readings: Exodus 24:3-8 ; Hebrews 9:11-15 ; Mark 14:12-16,22-26

Last week we had the great joy as a parish community of joining with the parents and families of 76 of our young parishioners as they made their first communion.

The first time they have had the chance to receive Jesus in Eucharistic form. It is important that they did it with us and we were with them. For the gift of the Eucharist, the Body of Jesus the Christ is not a gift for us to keep to ourselves. It is a gift to be celebrated in full participation as a parish community, as we gather round the altar table each weekend, in worship.



And is it any less of an event because at the moment we cannot receive the Blood of Jesus as we have become used to? Not at all! It should make us all the more grateful we can freely receive the Body of Christ in the Eucharist.

Over the last year we have experienced weeks when we couldn't gather as a full Eucharistic community. For the common good, the safety of ourselves, our fellow parishioners and our neighbours we had to stay away from the call to come together to celebrate the Body and Blood of Christ in our Eucharist. Perhaps you met instead in one of the parish's little churches or you tuned in to an Online celebration of Mass. Perhaps you simply had to go without this gift until we could gather again.


This period of absence can help us to appreciate the joy we have in being able to attend in person as a community. But it is more – when we receive the Eucharist it becomes part of us as followers of Jesus, the Son of God. Its part of us in our community, in our neighbourhood and in our world.

It can also be an act of solidarity with our fellow Christians around the world who currently cannot gather as we can. We come to the Lord's table on their behalf.

Let us today give thanks we can freely gather and hold in our worship all who follow the call of Jesus: "Take it, this is my Body."
