A bullet point reflection. That is 'bullet point' and not with any connotation towards violence.

- I think it is meaningful that Pope Francis entered into everlasting life during the Easter octave of this Jubilee year.
- At the time of writing the conclave has not started. I pray for our new pope to be very much Francis II – humble of heart with continued outreach to the poor, marginalised, and other faiths, and a force for peace and care of the earth around the world.
- From the gospel 'I gave my sheep eternal life' extends beyond the specific event of Jesus' resurrection, suggesting that the principle applies to all individuals and the world as a whole.
- The chaos of our times could be seen as a potential for new growth and a break-through towards wholeness.
- Death is a transformation not an end. A necessary step in the process of resurrection and becoming more deeply united with God.
- Easter as a feast of universal hope. A hope that includes individual lives and the broader human experience.
- Our connection to others and to the natural world is an essential part of the resurrection experience.
- As a Southland farm boy my experiences with sheep are not exactly biblical. Sheep are instinctively fearful and flock together when a sheepdog appears. Although a pet lamb called Topsy that became a pet sheep certainly was loyal and not fearful and quite liked getting into the sack of dog biscuits and the hens' laying mash when in the 'house paddock'. Still not a 'biblical' sheep but certainly knew a good thing when she saw it.


