"Peace be with You"

I am writing these words in the shadow of Easter and this week's major news item – Pope Francis has completed his journey to eternal life.

But I'm sure that these words take on such a profound significance when we look at the way Francis communicated this vivid message with his life. As with Jesus, who communicated this message to his disciples by showing them his wounds, Francis showed us that even in a wounded world filled with conflict and mistrust, peace can still be with us.

The compassion of God only flows into our lives when, like Thomas and the disciples, we feel and touch the wounds of others. Accepting that when we acknowledge the healing that is required around us in our world, our hearts move away from a place of selfishness, individualism and indifference.

By encountering the Resurrected Christ through His wounds, we too can better see Jesus as our "Lord and God". Even though we walk by faith and not by sight, Faith is not 'blind'. Faith allows us to see Jesus more clearly in all of our brothers and sisters, through the "cry of the Earth and the cry of the Poor". Our faith in believing in a visible God in front of us shapes and motivates our hearts to just be more 'human'.

Pope Francis touched many who were wounded, with the message of mercy and hope. Having a mind and heart set on 'ecological conversion', he reconnected those who were lost, and offered those who were marginalised hope. His frequent visits to prisons, conflict areas or meeting people in downtrodden places heralded a powerful message to the world— that no matter what, God never gives up on anyone. Love has the final word.
